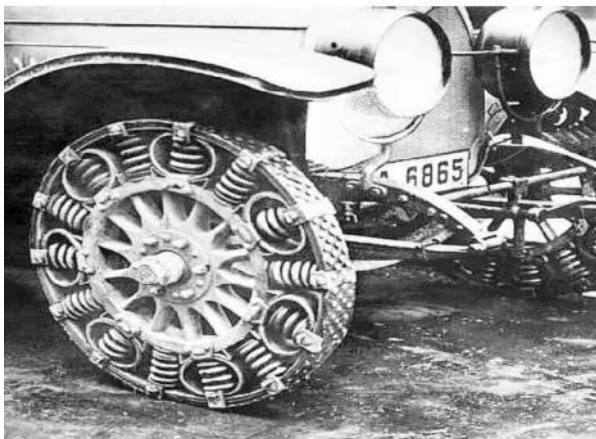

I ended up selling the car back to my cousin Eddie. But this time we were able to drive the car back to Saegertown. He had it for a few more years and ending up selling it.
