

*** *Get the low-down on fuel stabilizers* ***

The following link was offered by Ken Barker from Hagerty media. Per Ken, "You Tube video is a bit hokey, but actually imparts some thought provoking information. Actual product testing starts around 1:25 into the video." The preface article was also interesting.

An excerpt from the preface: "The ethanol in modern fuel is hygroscopic, meaning it attracts water. That H2O content can reach a point where it will separate from the fuel, especially in long term storage. That water sitting at the bottom of the tank is the first thing to be picked up by the fuel pickup. To address this, the stabilizer concoctions work to lower fuel's ability to pick up that moisture. They might also add some type of alcohol so that the heavier mixture will burn— however poorly—when drawn into the fuel system and dispersed in the combustion chamber."
