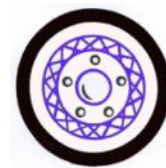

Feature Stories: (Information for this story was gathered at our last meeting held at Ted and Jean's house.) Each month I hope to tell you a little about some of the members in our club-in hopes that we can become a little more familiar with our club members and their cars.

Ted Hackett (our past president) has an interesting story about how he found his first antique car. Ted's elder son (Teddy) was in high school when they saw their 1929 Model A Ford in New Jersey. The car lay in a field about 2 blocks from the ocean. Ted offered the owner \$25.00 for the car. The owner informed him that he could buy it if he could get it out of the field. A tree had started to grow through the left front fender and they had to cut down the tree before they could attach a wench to it and pull it out. The car was completely rusted out but within a year they managed to get it running. The car had no seats and three fenders missing. Since then it has been reupholstered, repainted and the engine was rebuilt last year. Ted and his family average 1000 miles a year in this car. The second Model A that Ted bought was for his younger son David. This car, the rarer of the two, has four doors and is a Sedan. It was in running order when purchased. Ted is one of the first people to join our club and he credits his wife Jean for encouraging women to come to meetings and to get involved. Jean used to be the only woman in the club. Jean's dream car was a 1936 Ford Roadster that she saw at Ray Karlan's during a car club tour to Snowshoe, Pa. The car was valued at \$118,000.00 a little too steep for Jean. She loved it because when she sat in it she felt as if they were one. She later found out that the car had been stolen and Mr. Karlan hoped car club members would keep an eye out for any one selling part for that year car.
